WHAT IS ZERO WASTE

THE PROBLEM

Landfills are a significant source of the potent greenhouse gas methane, so it is important that we divert materials from landfill disposal.

WHAT DOES ZERO WASTE LOOK LIKE?

It is not about getting to zero. It is a commitment to reduce waste generated and reuse/recycle waste created in an attempt to minimize the overall waste delivered to landfills. Zero Waste supports:

- Reducing waste
- Promoting the best and highest use of material
- Promoting more sustainable consumption
- Endorsing resource conservation and preservation

DEFINITION OF ZERO WASTE

Zero Waste: The conservation of all resources by means of responsible production, consumption, reuse, and recovery of products, packaging, and materials without burning and with no discharges to land, water, or air that threaten the environment or human health.

LOCAL COMMITMENT

Jurisdictions in Sonoma County have implemented or are considering a Zero Waste Resolution with the goal of diverting 90% of all material from landfills by 2030. Furthermore, many jurisdictions have implemented Climate Emergency Resolutions with waste reduction related components.

COMPOST FOR THE CLIMATE

CLEAN AIR

In the atmosphere, carbon is found mostly in the form of carbon dioxide and methane, which act like blankets for the Earth. However, methane is 86 times better at trapping heat than carbon dioxide over 20 years. Composting organic materials like yard debris and food scraps prevents them from going into the landfill where the lack of oxygen causes methane to form.

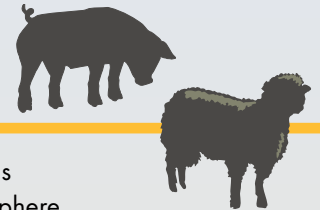


GROW PLANTS

Plants use the sun's heat to convert carbon dioxide into sugars and wood. Putting compost on soil gives more nutrients to the plant and so helps it grow faster and bigger. The larger the plant, the more carbon is taken out of the atmosphere—this is called carbon sequestration.



FEED PEOPLE AND ANIMALS



When plants grow bigger, more food is produced. People and animals digest the sugars in plants and exhale carbon dioxide into the atmosphere. Although we must decrease carbon emissions and increase carbon sequestration to slow climate change, some carbon dioxide is necessary for plants to grow.

COMPOST FOR HEALTHY SOILS

In addition to sequestering carbon and providing more nutrients to plants, compost increases aeration, water holding capacity, and biodiversity in the soil. This decreases the need for chemical fertilizers and pesticides. The carbon that is not converted into sugar or wood is stored in the soil.

ABOUT THE CARBON CYCLE

Carbon is the fourth most abundant element in the universe, and it can be found everywhere: in rocks, ocean, the atmosphere, soil, and living things. There is a balance in the way that carbon cycles through these different forms, and climate change is happening because there is more carbon released into the atmosphere than is getting stored in the ground. We can minimize our impact on the climate by not only reducing carbon emissions, but also by increasing carbon sequestration through composting.

SB 1383

California SB 1383 will require a 75% reduction of statewide landfill disposal of organic materials and a 20% increase in food recovery for human consumption by 2025.

TRANSPORTING AND PACKING YOUR MATERIAL: State transportation laws limit each vehicle to a maximum of 15 gallons of liquid (with a maximum of 5 gallons per container) or 125 pounds of solid material. Liquid limits are measured by the outer size of the container, not the contents. • Never mix chemicals.

• Place in sealed containers in the trunk, packed to prevent spills. • Sharps must be in a sealed and labeled approved container.

HHW ROVER PICKUP SERVICE

Each Wednesday, the HHW Rover serves a different region of Sonoma County. Home pickup services are provided on a first-come-first-served basis. Allow several weeks' advance notice.

FEE: \$50/pickup (limit 440 pounds or 54 gallons).
Limited free pickup available for seniors over 80 years of age and housebound residents.

TWO SERVICE OPTIONS FOR BUSINESSES

Services are available for businesses that qualify as Very Small Quantity Generators as per regulations (CCR Title 22 §66260.10), which are businesses that generate 100 kilograms (27 gallons liquid or 220 pounds solid) or less of hazardous waste per month.

HHW FACILITY BUSINESS PROGRAM

Located at the Central Disposal Site, the HHW Facility is open for drop-off of hazardous waste from qualified Sonoma County businesses.

COMMON EXAMPLES OF HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE Household hazardous wastes are any unwanted products commonly labeled as toxic, poison, combustible, corrosive, flammable, or irritant, etc.

YARD: Fertilizers • Fungicides • Insecticides • Pesticides • Pool chemicals • Propane cylinders, 5 gallons and smaller • Rodenticides • Weed killers

HOUSE: Aerosol sprays • Asbestos • Batteries • Cleaners • Cosmetics • Fire extinguishers • Fluorescent lamps • LED lights • Medications • Nail polish and remover • Sharps/needles • Toiletries

GARAGE: Antifreeze • Auto batteries • Automatic transmission fluid • Brake fluid • Engine cleaners • Road flares • Fuel such as butane, diesel, gasoline, kerosene and lamp oil • Motor oil and filters • Power-steering fluid

WORKSHOP: Flammable liquids and solids • Glues • Paint • Paint thinners • Photo chemicals • Solvents • Wood finishes

WHAT IS THE PROCESS?

1. Download Business Hazardous Waste Disposal Forms from zerowastesonoma.gov
2. Obtain a Hazardous Waste EPA ID number (if needed).
3. Submit paperwork by fax or email to receive an appointment and pricing information.

WILL THIS PROGRAM MEET THE DISPOSAL REQUIREMENTS OF REGULATING AGENCIES?

You will receive a receipt of disposal for your records that will satisfy regulatory disposal requirements. Receipts and all records should be kept for a minimum of three years.

DOES USING THIS PROGRAM MEAN MY BUSINESS WILL BE INSPECTED FOR HAZARDOUS WASTE?

Zero Waste Sonoma is not a regulatory agency.

CURBSIDE SERVICES FOR RESIDENTS

Bulky item pickup means that certain items such as mattresses, appliances, furniture, excess yard debris/organics (bagged or bundled), and electronics★ that cannot fit into the garbage or yard debris cart or that need special handling will be picked up by appointment. This service is available for residential hauling company customers for a fee or at no cost. In addition, some communities offer free Curbside Cleanup Events.

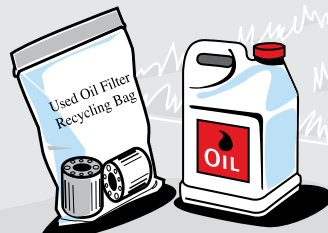

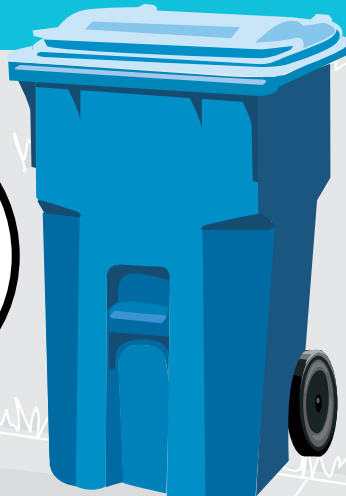

HOW CLEAN DO YOUR RECYCLABLES NEED TO BE

Recycling standards are getting stricter. The market is requiring high-quality materials. Bottles and containers need to be empty of food and liquid. Paper needs to be clean and dry. Follow the steps below:

POUR OUT LIQUIDS

SCRAPE OUT FOOD FROM RECYCLABLES

WIPE OUT OILY OR STICKY RESIDUE FROM RECYCLABLES

GREASY, GRIMY, GOOEY, WET, OR FOOD-SOILED PAPER GOES IN YOUR COMPOST CART

Meat, cheese, and bones are not accepted in the compost cart in areas served by Sonoma Garbage Collectors.

WINDSOR ONLY



In Windsor, your recyclable materials must be separated. Put metal, glass, and plastic containers on the blue side and put cardboard and paper on the yellow side.

TIP: KEEP CAPS ON



It is preferable to leave screw-top lids on empty plastic, glass, and metal containers. If lids are removed from the container, they are too small to be recycled.

CHECK YOUR SUPPLIES BEFORE SHOPPING Use up the food you have.

STICK TO A GROCERY LIST to avoid impulsive buying. Don't shop when you're hungry.

PROACTIVELY FREEZE bread, vegetables, dairy, and meat before they go bad if you buy in bulk and don't go through the food fast enough.



BUY A VARIETY OF FOOD Some foods last longer than others. Eat leafy greens and mushrooms first, but keep root vegetables and squash in the pantry to eat later.

PURCHASE FOOD THAT IS IN SEASON for the greatest value, least embedded food miles, and longevity of shelf life. Further, consider purchasing from local farmers and markets first when planning your shopping; that ensures seasonality, freshness, minimal packaging, and maximum impact on the local economy.

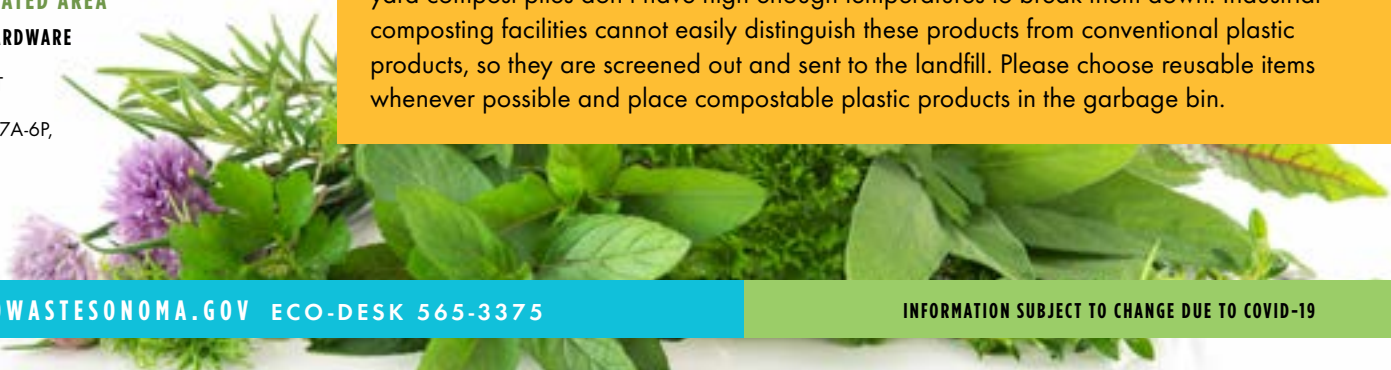

PROBLEM WITH BIODEGRADABLE AND COMPOSTABLE PLASTIC PRODUCTS

Plates, bowls, cups, utensils, bags, or other food service ware labeled **biodegradable** or **compostable** cannot be composted in the backyard or placed in curbside carts. Backyard compost piles don't have high enough temperatures to break them down. Industrial composting facilities cannot easily distinguish these products from conventional plastic products, so they are screened out and sent to the landfill. Please choose reusable items whenever possible and place compostable plastic products in the garbage bin.

The recycling industry is controlled by economics of supply and demand. When you buy goods made with recycled content, your purchases help create a demand for materials collected in recycling programs.

Remember to ask stores you frequent which products they carry are made with post-consumer content. This means the product was made from materials that were used and recycled by consumers, rather than from virgin material.

REUSE-TO-GO



There are many things you can do to reduce your trash footprint. Make a pledge to continue doing the things you already do, and choose new actions you are willing to commit to. For example:

ARE YOU A DO-IT-YOURSELFER? RECYCLE YOUR MOTOR OIL AND FILTER TOO!

HOW TO USE OIL COLLECTION SITES



DID YOU KNOW THAT USED MOTOR OIL NEVER WEARS OUT? IT JUST GETS DIRTY AND CAN BE RECYCLED, CLEANED, AND USED AGAIN. Place your motor oil in a drain pan or sealed see-through reusable container you take back with you. Some sites offer a 40¢ per gallon rebate for used motor oil.

VISIT SITES DURING BUSINESS HOURS. ABANDONING OIL OR ANY OTHER SUBSTANCE IN ANY QUANTITY AFTER HOURS IS NOT RECYCLING! IT IS ILLEGAL, PUNISHABLE BY IMPRISONMENT OR A FINE UP TO \$10,000.

- Sites typically accept no more than 5 gallons of used motor oil and 2 filters at one time.
- One or 2 oil filters are usually accepted for free; some locations charge up to \$3.
- Antifreeze fees range from no cost to \$3/gallon.

ABOUT CONTAMINATED OIL

Sites will not accept used motor oil that has been contaminated with other fluids such as antifreeze, solvents, gasoline, or water. Even a small amount of contamination causes the entire tank of motor oil collected to become non-recyclable. BUSINESS LAWS

SB 1383 SHORT-LIVED CLIMATE POLLUTANTS

APPLIES TO ALL COMMERCIAL ENTITIES, INCLUDING FOR-PROFIT AND NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS, PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SCHOOLS, GOVERNMENT BUILDINGS, AND MULTIFAMILY RESIDENTIAL DWELLINGS.



Signed into law by Governor Brown in 2016, SB 1383 mandates statewide actions to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and air pollution. The bill establishes two main targets:

BY 2020

Reduce disposal of organic materials in landfills by 50% from the 2014 level.

BY 2025

Reduce disposal of organic materials in landfills by 75% from the 2014 level. By this point, no less than 20% of edible food currently disposed must also be recovered for human consumption.

SB 1383 serves as the regulatory force behind both AB 341 and AB 1826, and it imposes heavy fines for noncompliance.

AB 341 MANDATORY COMMERCIAL RECYCLING

APPLIES TO ALL COMMERCIAL ENTITIES AND ESTABLISHMENTS THAT PRODUCE 4 CUBIC YARDS OR MORE OF COMMERCIAL SOLID WASTE PER WEEK. THIS INCLUDES FOR-PROFIT AND NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS, PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SCHOOLS, GOVERNMENT BUILDINGS, AND MULTIFAMILY RESIDENTIAL DWELLINGS WITH 5 OR MORE UNITS.

Signed into law by Governor Brown in 2011, AB 341 mandates commercial entities that meet the 4 cubic yard threshold to divert recyclables from the landfill.

AB 1826 MANDATORY ORGANICS RECYCLING

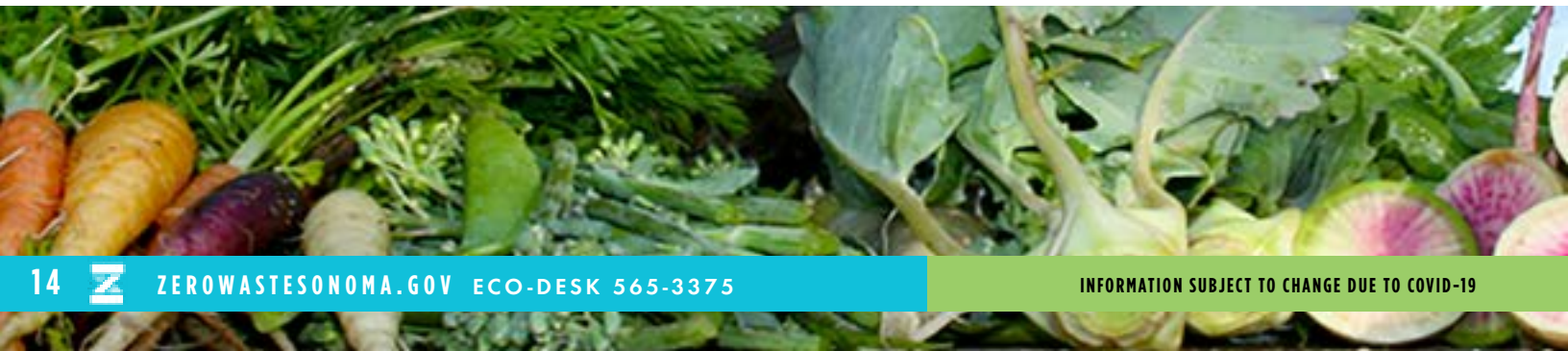
APPLIES TO ALL COMMERCIAL ENTITIES AND ESTABLISHMENTS THAT PRODUCE 4 CUBIC YARDS OR MORE OF COMMERCIAL SOLID WASTE PER WEEK. THIS INCLUDES FOR-PROFIT AND NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS, PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SCHOOLS, GOVERNMENT BUILDINGS, AND MULTIFAMILY RESIDENTIAL DWELLINGS WITH 5 OR MORE UNITS.

Signed into law by Governor Brown in 2014, AB 1826 requires commercial entities that meet the 4 cubic yard of solid waste threshold to divert organic materials from the landfill. Solid waste means the entire waste stream, including garbage and recycling.

THE STATE DEFINES ORGANICS AS FOOD, GREEN MATERIALS, LANDSCAPE/PRUNINGS, NON-HAZARDOUS WOOD SCRAP, AND FOOD-SOILED PAPER

HOW TO COMPLY

APPLIES TO FOOD/BEVERAGE PROVIDERS, RETAILERS, SPECIAL EVENT PROMOTERS, GOVERNMENT ENTITIES, CONTRACTORS, AND LESSEES.

Jurisdictions in Sonoma County have implemented or are considering a model ordinance to ban the sale of certain polystyrene foam products and limit the use of non-recyclable or non-compostable disposable food ware. Please confirm specific requirements within your jurisdiction.

ABOUT THE MODEL ORDINANCE

- Prohibits polystyrene foam food ware distributed by food and beverage providers.
- Prohibits polystyrene foam food ware and specified polystyrene foam products sold by retail stores.
- Requires food/beverage providers and special events to use compostable or recyclable single-use food service ware.
- Requires food/beverage providers to provide single-use straws, lids, cutlery, and to-go condiment packages only upon request.
- Encourages use of reusables.

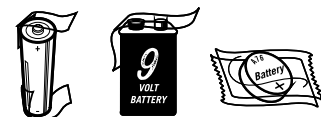

FLUORESCENT LAMPS NEED SPECIAL DISPOSAL



Fluorescent lamps contain mercury vapor. Although the amount of mercury vapor in each lamp is small, care should still be taken in handling and disposing of fluorescent lamps.

WHAT IF A LAMP BREAKS?

- Open a window and leave the room for 15 minutes or more.
- Turn off central heat/air conditioning.
- Do not vacuum. Instead, collect the pieces using a stiff piece of paper, such as an index card.
- Pat the area with the sticky side of packing tape to remove glass shards.
- Put all material into a sealed container.

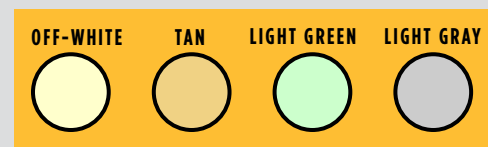

WHAT'S THE PROBLEM

DANGER TO WORKERS



California State Law makes it illegal to dispose of home-generated sharps in the garbage or recycling bin.

This includes hypodermic needles, pen needles, intravenous needles, lancets, and other devices that are used to penetrate the skin for delivery of medications used in the care of people and animals.

When placed in the garbage or recycling bin, sharps can injure sanitation workers.

HOW TO PREPARE

- For drop-off, sharps must be in FDA-approved sharps containers.
- The only legal way to transport used sharps is in an FDA-approved sharps container.
- The container must be labeled **Sharps Waste** and **Biohazard**.
- Sharps waste will not be accepted in paper bags, plastic bags, or non-approved containers.
- Household Hazardous Waste programs will not accept sharps that contain controlled substances.
