WHAT IS ZERO WASTE?

THE PROBLEM

Landfills are a significant source of the potent greenhouse gas methane, created when organic materials like food waste decompose without oxygen. Organics, recyclables, and many other materials are resource-intensive to manufacture and limited in supply. They should instead be reused and recycled to sustain economies and healthy communities for the long term.

DEFINITION OF ZERO WASTE

Zero waste is a philosophy that promotes reuse, recycling, composting and conservation programs, and emphasizes sustainability by considering the entire life-cycle of products and systems.

BACK TO THE BASICS

REVISITING RECYCLING

IS IT RECYCLABLE? SEE PAGE 7



It is time to go back to the basics of the "Three R's." Recycling is a big part of achieving zero waste, but people are growing more concerned that the items they recycle curbside are not actually recycled. Don't worry; they are, but mold, moisture, and non-recyclable items cause contamination of the load, increasing the likelihood that some recyclables get landfilled. When in doubt, check our website to see if an item can be recycled. Remember to place clean paper and dry, flattened cardboard boxes in the recycling cart. Make sure your curbside cart lid closes completely to ensure materials don't get wet or dirty. Pour out liquids from plastic bottles, aluminum cans, and glass bottles before placing in your recycle bin. Leftover food from plastic containers and greasy napkins should be composted in the green bin. Always place recyclables loose in your cart; do not bag recyclables. Plastic bags prevent materials from being sorted and can get stuck in recycling machinery. Practicing these good habits helps ensure recovery and reuse of recyclable materials.

TRANSPORTING AND PACKING YOUR MATERIAL: State transportation laws limit each vehicle to a maximum of 15 gallons of liquid (with a maximum of 5 gallons per container) or 125 pounds of solid material. Liquid limits are measured by the outer size of the container, not the contents. • Never mix chemicals. • Place in sealed containers in the trunk, packed to prevent spills. • Sharps must be in a sealed and labeled approved container. TWO SERVICE OPTIONS FOR BUSINESSES

Services are available for businesses that qualify as Very Small Quantity Generators as per regulations (CCR Title 22 §66260.10), which are businesses that generate 100 kilograms (27 gallons liquid or 220 pounds solid) or less of hazardous waste per month.

- 1. Download Business Hazardous Waste Disposal Forms from zerowastesonoma.gov
- 2. Obtain a Hazardous Waste EPA ID number (if needed).
- 3. Submit paperwork by fax or email to receive an appointment and pricing information.

WILL THIS PROGRAM MEET THE DISPOSAL **REQUIREMENTS OF REGULATING AGENCIES?**

You will receive a receipt of disposal for your records that will satisfy regulatory disposal requirements. Receipts and all records should be kept for a minimum of three years.

DOES USING THIS PROGRAM MEAN MY BUSINESS WILL BE INSPECTED FOR HAZARDOUS WASTE?







SHREDDED PAPER SONOMA GARBAGE COLLECTORS CUSTOMERS ONLY

FOR CUSTOMERS OF SONOMA GARBAGE COLLECTORS, PUT SHREDDED PAPER IN A CLEAR PLASTIC BAG INSIDE THE CART.



TO PREVENT FIRES:

TAPE THE TERMINALS OF ALL RECHARGEABLE BATTERIES AND ALKALINE BATTERIES 9-VOLT OR LARGER. TAPE YOUR BATTERIES WITH HEAVY-DUTY CLEAR TAPE.

PLACE BATTERIES IN A CLEAR BAG AND SEAL FIRMLY.

PLACE BAG **ON TOP** OF BLUE RECYCLE CART FOR PICK UP.

HOW CLEAN DO YOUR RECYCLABLES NEED TO BE?

Recyclables are economic commodities. Cleaner items are more likely to be recycled. Bottles and containers need to be empty of food and liquid. Paper needs to be clean and dry. Follow the steps below:

POUR OUT LIQUIDS

SCRAPE OUT FOOD FROM RECYCLABLES

WIPE OUT STICKY OR OILY RESIDUE FROM RECYCLABLES

GREASY, GOOEY, WET, OR FOOD-SOILED PAPER GOES IN YOUR COMPOST CART

WINDSOR ONLY



In Windsor, your recyclable materials must be separated. Put metal, glass, and plastic containers on the blue side and put cardboard and paper on the yellow side. Place shredded paper in a paper bag inside the yellow side.

TIP: KEEP CAPS ON



It is preferable to leave screw-top lids on empty plastic, glass, and metal containers. If lids are removed from the container, they are too small to be recycled.

PREVENT FOOD LOSS AND SAVE MONEY

CHECK YOUR SUPPLIES BEFORE SHOPPING to use up the food you have.

STICK TO A GROCERY LIST to avoid impulsive buying. Don't shop when you're hungry.

PROACTIVELY FREEZE bread, vegetables, dairy, and meat before they go bad if you don't go through the food fast enough.

DRY OR FERMENT extra food. Learn more through the Master Food Preservers: https://ucanr.edu/sites/MFPSC/

BUY A VARIETY OF FOOD to have nutritious meals available through the week. Some foods last longer than others. Vegetables like leafy greens and mushrooms spoil more quickly than root vegetables and squashes so plan accordingly.

PURCHASE FOOD THAT IS IN SEASON for the greatest value, the least embedded food miles, and longevity of shelf life. Further, consider purchasing from local farmers and markets first when planning your shopping; that ensures seasonality, freshness, minimal packaging, and maximum impact on the local economy.

CREATE AND USE COMPOST

Food loss prevention and donation are best, but when food spoilage occurs, please compost! Turn organic materials like plant trimmings and food scraps into a nutrient-rich soil amendment. Compost helps plants grow and improves water retention in soil. To find a compost giveaway near you, visit: zerowastesonoma.gov/compost-giveaways.

THE PROBLEM WITH BIODEGRADABLE AND COMPOSTABLE PLASTIC PRODUCTS

Plates, bowls, cups, utensils, bags, or other food service ware labeled biodegradable or compostable cannot be composted in the backyard or placed in curbside green carts. Backyard compost piles don't reach high enough temperatures to break them down. Industrial composting facilities cannot easily distinguish these products from conventional plastic products, so they are screened out and sent to the landfill. Please choose reusable items whenever possible and place compostable plastic products in the garbage cart.

DONATE FOOD TO PEOPLE

Donate perishable and non-perishable food to feed people. Only food that is fresh (not expired), whole, and/or with intact and unopened packaging accepted.

The recycling industry is controlled by economics of supply and demand. When you buy goods made with recycled content, your purchases help create a demand for materials collected in recycling programs.

Remember to ask stores you frequent which products they carry are made with post-consumer content. This means the product was made from materials that were used and recycled by consumers, rather than from virgin material.

HOW TO USE OIL **COLLECTION SITES**



DID YOU KNOW THAT USED MOTOR OIL **NEVER WEARS OUT? IT JUST GETS DIRTY** AND CAN BE RECYCLED, CLEANED, AND USED AGAIN. Place your motor oil in a drain pan or sealed see-through reusable container you take back with you. Some sites offer a 40¢ per gallon rebate for used motor oil.

VISIT SITES DURING BUSINESS HOURS. ABANDONING OIL OR ANY OTHER SUBSTANCE IN ANY QUANTITY AFTER HOURS IS NOT RECYCLING! IT IS ILLEGAL, PUNISHABLE BY IMPRISONMENT OR A FINE UP TO \$10,000.

- Sites typically accept no more than 5 gallons of used motor oil and 2 filters at one time.
- 1 or 2 oil filters are usually accepted for free; some locations charge up to \$3.
- · Antifreeze fees range from no cost to \$3/gallon.

ABOUT CONTAMINATED OIL

Sites will not accept used motor oil that has been contaminated with other fluids such as antifreeze, solvents, gasoline, or water. POLICY

AB 827 COMMERCIAL ORGANICS AND RECYCLING BINS

CUSTOMER ACCESS TO RECYCLING: REQUIRES BUSINESSES TO MAKE COMPOSTING AND RECYCLING BINS ACCESSIBLE TO CUSTOMERS AT RESTAURANTS, MALLS, AND OTHER BUSINESSES.



Commercial businesses that serve food for immediate consumption must provide customers access to organic collection bins on the premises. Organics bins must be in addition and adjacent to recycling and trash. Bins must be correctly and clearly marked with educational signage indicating what can and cannot go into each bin. Full service restaurants are exempt as long as the bins are provided to employees.

APPLIES TO ALL RESIDENTS AND COMMERCIAL ENTITIES, INCLUDING FOR-PROFIT AND NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS, PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SCHOOLS, GOVERNMENT BUILDINGS, AND MULTIFAMILY **RESIDENTIAL DWELLINGS**


In effect since Jan 1, 2022, Senate Bill 1383 is a comprehensive state law aimed at reducing greenhouse gas emissions to slow climate change.

THE STATE DEFINES ORGANICS AS FOOD, GREEN MATERIALS, LANDSCAPE/ PRUNINGS, NON-HAZARDOUS WOOD SCRAP, AND FOOD-SOILED PAPER

HOW TO COMPLY

- All residents and commercial entities are required to subscribe to curbside organics collection (green bin) service in addition to recycling and garbage.
- · All residents and commercial entities must separate food scraps, plant trimmings, foodsoiled paper, and other organic materials from the garbage and place them into the green bin to be sent for composting.
- Commercial entities include for profit and nonprofit organizations, public and private schools, government buildings, and multifamily residential dwellings.

FEED PEOPLE, NOT LANDFILLS!

In addition, large food producing entities, called Tier I and Tier II Entities under the law, are required to donate excess food to feed people.

Food must be safe to eat, whole, unserved, and/or in unopened and original packaging although they might be blemished, less marketable, or slightly stale.

Tier I and II Entities include supermarkets, grocery stores, wholesalers, food distributors, restaurants over 5000 sq ft., and education facilities. For more information and resources, visit zerowastesonoma.gov/SB1383

BUSINESS LAWS & ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

DISPOSABLE FOOD SERVICE WARE AND POLYSTYRENE FOAM BAN MODEL ORDINANCE

APPLIES TO FOOD/BEVERAGE PROVIDERS, RETAILERS, SPECIAL EVENT PROMOTERS, GOVERNMENT ENTITIES, CONTRACTORS, AND LESSEES.

Jurisdictions in Sonoma County have implemented a model ordinance to ban the sale of certain polystyrene foam products and limit the use of non-recyclable or non-compostable disposable food ware. Please confirm specific requirements within your jurisdiction.

ABOUT THE MODEL ORDINANCE

- Prohibits polystyrene foam food ware and foodware containing per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) distributed by food and beverage providers.
- Prohibits polystyrene foam food ware and specified polystyrene foam products sold by retail stores.

- Requires food/beverage providers to provide single-use straws, lids, cutlery, and to-go condiment packages only upon request.
- Encourages use of reusables.

ORDINANCE NO. 2014-2 WASTE REDUCTION PROGRAM FOR CARRYOUT BAGS ORDINANCE

- Prohibits all single-use plastic carryout bags (point-of-sale or checkout).
- Requires a minimum 10¢ charge on all compliant recycled paper bags.
- Charge must be displayed separately on customer receipt.
- Stores to keep the charge.



FLUORESCENT LAMPS NEED SPECIAL DISPOSAL



Fluorescent lamps contain mercury vapor. Although the amount of mercury vapor in each lamp is small, care should still be taken in handling and disposing of fluorescent lamps.

WHAT IF A LAMP BREAKS?

- Open a window and leave the room for 15 minutes or more.
- Turn off central heat/air conditioning.
- Do not vacuum. Instead, collect the pieces using a stiff piece of paper, such as an index card.
- Pat the area with the sticky side of packing tape to remove glass
- Put all material into a sealed container.



SHARPS/NEEDLES

SB 212 PHARMACEUTICAL AND SHARPS STEWARDSHIP BILL

IN 2018, CALIFORNIA PASSED THE PHARMACEUTICAL AND SHARPS STEWARDSHIP BILL REQUIRING PRODUCERS OF PHARMACEUTICALS AND SHARPS TO MANAGE AND OPERATE A COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL PROGRAM. THE STEWARDSHIP PROGRAMS HAVE STARTED TO ROLL OUT ACROSS THE STATE. HERE'S HOW TO PROPERLY DISPOSE OF SHARPS UNDER THE NEW LAW:

MAIL-BACK

Mail-back options are dependent on your retailer (pharmacy, online provider, veterinarian, etc.) that provided you with sharps. All disposal options are free. Option 1: the retailer has a supply of mail-back sharps waste containers and will provide it to you with the purchase of sharps. Option 2: the retailer will ask a stewardship program to send a mail-back sharps waste container to your home address. As this is a new program, it is best to ask your sharps retailer how to receive a mailback waste container at the point of purchase of sharps.

If your sharps retailer doesn't participate with a stewardship program yet, you may contact them directly. Some stewardship programs are brand-specific and may not accept all brands of sharps.



WHAT'S THE PROBLEM DANGER TO WORKERS



California State Law makes it illegal to dispose of home-generated sharps in the garbage or recycling bin.

This includes hypodermic needles, pen needles, intravenous needles, lancets, and other devices that are used to penetrate the skin for delivery of medications used in the care of people and animals.

When placed in the garbage or recycling bin, sharps can injure sanitation workers.

DROP-OFF AT HHW PROGRAMS

HHW facilities are allowed to accept sharps under SB 212. To drop-off, follow these instructions:

- For drop-off, sharps must be in FDA-approved sharps containers.
- The only legal way to transport used sharps is in an FDA-approved sharps container.
- The container must be labeled **Sharps Waste** and Biohazard.
- Sharps waste will not be accepted in paper bags, plastic bags, or non-approved containers.
- Household Hazardous Waste programs will not accept sharps that contain controlled substances.
