

Response: The Sonoma County Waste Management Agency is currently studying the environmental impact of three disposal options for Sonoma County MSW - truck haul to out of county landfills, rail haul to out of county landfills, and sale of the County-owned Central Landfill to a private operator and resulting resumption of landfill activities at the Central Landfill. The EIR is expected to be complete in 2009. The results of the EIR will help the County determine how to secure at least 15 years of disposal capacity.

Siting Element Adequacy

3. Question: Does the Siting Element need to be revised? The Siting Element will need to be revised if you have less than 15 years disposal capacity and have not described a strategy for obtaining 15 years disposal capacity. Response: Yes. The Siting Element revision is included in the aforementioned EIR.

Response: Yes. Due to the suspension of landfill activities at Sonoma County's Central Disposal Site and the lack of 15 years of disposal capacity, CIWMB staff has requested to the SCWMA to provide additional information about the revisions the Siting Element. SCWMA staff agreed to provide additional details after results of the Environmental Impact Report for the Siting Element are known.


