The Sonoma County Waste Management Agency is currently studying the environmental impact of three disposal options for Sonoma County MSW - truck haul to out of county landfills, rail haul to out of county landfills, and sale of the County-owned Central Landfill to a private operator and resulting resumption of landfill activities at the Central Landfill. The EIR is expected to be complete in 2009. The results of the EIR will help the County determine how to secure at least 15 years of disposal capacity.
