To Whom It May Concern:

As the regional agency responsible for reporting solid waste issues to the California Integrated Waste Management Board, the Sonoma County Waste Management Agency ("Agency") is required by State law and regulations to notify you that there has been a misallocation of solid waste generated by your residents and the River Rock Casino. According to Title 14, California Code of Regulations, Section 18801(a)(8) solid waste generated from your residents and facilities should not be allocated to any jurisdiction and should be reported as being imported from outside the State of California. Reporting your solid waste as "out-of-state" waste ensures a jurisdiction's ability to achieve and maintain its diversion rates and its ability to meet the solid waste mandates set forth in the California Integrated Waste Management Act.

The Agency worked with your contracted trash hauler to determine the amount of solid waste generated by residents, the River Rock Casino operations. It was determined that 311.72 tons of solid waste was by North Bay Corporation directly to the Healdsburg Transfer Station for transfer out of the county.

It is the Agency's intent to include the 311.72 tons in its 2009 "Reporting Year Disposal Tonnage Modification Request and Certification" to the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery to request that this tonnage be deducted from the total disposal tonnage for the Agency which represents the nine incorporated cities and the unincorporated areas in Sonoma County.
